

YEAR END STORAGE CHECKLIST

Maintenance



Provided is a checklist of things to check and to prepare your inTech Trailer for long term storage or winter storage.

- Remove all food, canned and otherwise, and clean trailer thoroughly.
- Turn refrigerator off and leave refrigerator doors propped open.
- Winterize your plumbing system (See: [inTech Plumbing Winterization Guide](#))
- Lower the stabilizers jacks to help support the trailer (if equipped)
- Check tire pressures and adjust to the maximum allowed and cover them if the trailer will be stored outside to protect the rubber from UV rays. (See: [Wheel Torque and Tire Pressures](#))
- Check 12V house battery water level (if marine deep cycle) and refill to proper levels with distilled water as necessary.
- Turn battery disconnect switch to Off position for long term storage.
- Turn off any propane tanks.
- Remove propane alarm fuse from 12V fuse panel (replace before using the following season)
- Remove smoke detector from wall and power source. (replace before using the following season)
- Close all windows, roof vent, and lock all doors.
- Optionally: Keep battery charged by connecting a solar charger to the trailer connector or running plugging into a shore cord if an on-board converter is installed in the system.

These steps can also be followed in reverse when the trailer is being brought out of storage for first use during the season.
